Behaviour Statement



The Education and Inspections Act of 2006 requires all schools to provide a written statement of behaviour principles.

The purpose of this statement is to give guidance to the headteacher in drawing up the Behaviour and Exclusion policy by stating the principles the governors expect to be followed.

Barwick and Stoford Community Primary School Behaviour Principles

The Governing Body has identified key principles behaviour:

- The behaviour policy must be based on consultation with all stakeholders
- All stakeholders are to understand and agree with what is deemed acceptable behaviour at Barwick and Stoford Community Primary School
- The school will ensure a positive approach underpins the ethos of the behaviour and exclusion policy.
- Sanctions will be challenging to ensure a high standard of behaviour and these sanctions will be clearly understood by all stakeholders
- Behaviour will be dealt with consistently and fairly across the school reflecting the School's Equality Statement and legal duty to comply with the Equality Act 2010 and the use of reasonable force will be clearly outlined in the school behaviour and exclusion policy.
- A clear code of conduct will be established for all persons working with children as well as for the children themselves.

This statement will be reviewed in line with the Behaviour and Exclusion Policy
